There was some discussion about where the money was coming from, the tribal issues within the county and the agency challenges to make the school routes and public trails safe.

Larry Montoya from UDOT Region 3 joined the meeting via zoom and stated that UDOT

and Special Service District #2 were involved with this project and are excited to help. Mr. Montoya also thanked Sunrise Engineering and Mr. Hyde for their time and efforts with the Trails Master Plan.

Tyson Todd, a representative from SITLA, explained how their funds work generating revenue for public education. Mr. Todd stated the Master Plan is great for the general public and schools in the area and feels it is in the best interest of all the beneficiaries involved.

There was some discussion about OHV funds and how they are disbursed.

Mr. Hyde thanked Mr. Todd for his efforts and representation in the Uintah Basin.

With no other questions or comments the public hearing was closed.

Chairman Wells said he would entertain a motion.

Commissioner Sorensen motioned to accept the proposed trails master plan and make a recommendation to the County Commissioners. Commissioner Richens seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
